Pedestrians urged to follow safety signs

Contractors are working to give foot traffic equal attention while reconstructing a portion of 11th Street in downtown Sioux Falls.

D&G Concrete Construction is placing temporary boardwalks in some areas and reminds pedestrians that shortcuts through any construction zone can be dangerous. Company President Greg Branaugh urges people to follow safety signs restricting foot traffic to designated areas.

The local company will continue its project between Minnesota and Main avenues through early August. Vehicles must adjust from three lanes to one on the eastbound one-way, driving in the former parking lane on the north side of the street.

That also means a change for YMCA and YWCA members who are used to dropping off or picking up children via 11th Street. They now will find loading zones with 10-minute limits on Dakota Avenue, east of the buildings.
